In January 2012, we were able to give \$500 to each of these local ministries. Praise God!

Volunteers must meet the following requirements:

- i. Active participation in SAUMC activities for a minimum of six (6) months; and
- ii. Must be eighteen (18) years or older; and
[Exception: A younger teen may assist with a screened adult but may not be alone with an assigned group.]
- iii. Must be three (3) years older than the participants in an assigned group.

TEACHER'S CORNER – by Paul Sims

*revelation scripture covenant-maker humankind
sin grace salvation Jesus atonement confession
faith Holy Spirit Trinity people of God church

There is no justice without judgment, so judgment requires faith – faith that God, our judge, will indeed give justice. Therefore, our understanding of judgment plays an important part in our attitude toward God. After all, if God is not just, what hope or order can the universe hold?

In the Old Testament, the Israelites believed that judgment produced rewards and punishments in this life – on this earth. They also believed judgment could be delayed, falling upon later generations. The theme of judgment continues in the New Testament, but the emphasis there is on a Day of Judgment, something that will take place in the future (Matt. 11:21-22; 12:36).

The New Testament teaches that we cannot in any way win our salvation by works of human righteousness; that salvation comes by grace alone. And yet the several descriptions of judgment in the New Testament speak almost exclusively of the *deeds* a person has done. How are we to understand this? There is an indication in the parable of the talents. There judgment was based on what the servants did with what was entrusted to them. So, though we have the gift of grace, it matters what we do with it. Christ's sacrifice does not endorse spiritual laziness. A faith that has no works is dead. It is not enough to do good works; we must do the works of goodness in a spirit that pleases God. We cannot leave God out of our lives. We must follow the commands of God and the example of Jesus.

Judgment, then, is ultimately a faith issue, something that should be left to God. There is no particular value in the statement, "I just can't believe God would be like that." Our personal opinions about God don't carry much weight. Rather, we ought to live and place our faith in such a way that we do not fear divine judgment. Indeed, judgment should constantly remind us of the gravity of being human. Our lives have consequence. Our deeds, words, and thoughts, have eternal significance. To be human is to be responsible. Anything less is an affront to God, in whose image we are made. It's good that judgment is God's alone.

We believe that the God who judges us also loves us. We are to live our lives in that love.

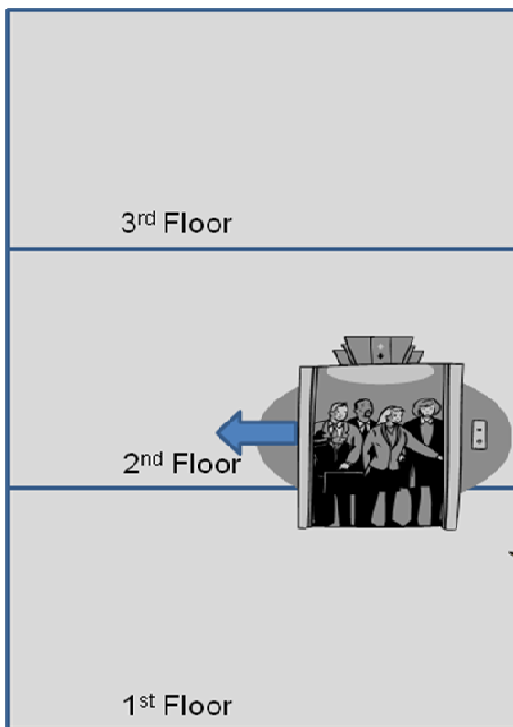


The Building Committee met on January 8, 2012, and reviewed the preliminary design to tile the drainage ditch on the church property. The design was drawn by Patrick Perez and he is continuing to refine it. A committee was appointed to plan a Building Program presentation for the congregation in the near future. As of January 8, 2012, we have received \$420,179 or 40.98% of the \$1,025,310 pledged in May, 2010 for the new building. The next meeting of the Building Committee is scheduled for Sunday, January 29, 2012 at 5:30 p.m. and is open to all members of the congregation. Minutes of the Building Committee meetings are on file in the office of Kim Tingler and are available for review by Saint Andrews members. Thank you for your support, patience, understanding and encouragement in working through the Building Plan Process.
