**BLOOD DRIVE AT SAINT ANDREWS**

A blood drive at Saint Andrews is scheduled for Monday, June 18<sup>th</sup> from 4:00-7:00 p.m. Anyone that is in good health, at least 17 years old, and weighs at least 110 pounds may donate. About the only exception would be if you had traveled outside the United States in the last year and you may check with a staff person to see if you are exempt. There is no longer a 12 month deferral for receiving a tattoo. Donors may not be taking antibiotics. Symptoms and medication should cease for at least 24 hours before donating blood.

When the last blood drive was held in August, 23 members and friends of Saint Andrews were able to donate. These 23 units of blood were able to help 90 people. Please signup and encourage your friends and neighbors to give the gift of life and start the summer off right. There will be a signup sheets in the Narthex soon.

**TEACHER’S CORNER – by Paul Sims**

“... all these things we pray in Jesus’ name. Amen.” Why do we so often end our prayers this way? Is it because we have heard others do it – so often? What does it really mean to pray “in Jesus’ name?” What should it mean? Jesus himself said that we should pray in his name. (See John 14:13; 14:14; 15:16; and 16:23-24.) But why?

Lewis Maclachlan says, “Prayer in the name of Jesus is prayer that is offered... with authority derived from the fellowship of all believers, in which we are members... It is this citizenship in heaven which gives us confidence... Prayer is not only a turning to God but a revolt from the powers of darkness... When we pray in the name of Christ we assert the authority of the one who has defeated evil...”

“If we cannot begin to pray in the spirit of love we must remain in prayer until our turbulent emotions are calmed by the consciousness of God, until all self-importance and self-pity subside, until that natural and good-natured indifference (which, and not hatred, is the worst enemy of love and the cause of so much suffering in the world) is changed into a love and active desire to share with all our neighbors the rich resources of our God.”

Maxie Dunnam adds a number of insights as well. “Prayer in Jesus’ name flows with power from lives *lived* in Jesus’ name.” Presumably, if we are praying, it is because we are seeking God’s will for us (part of prayer is *listening* to God) and we are seeking to live a life *in Jesus’ name* – “seeking to express the Kingdom” in all we do, intentionally giving ourselves “to the ruling presence of Jesus.”

Dunnam says, “To pray in the name of Jesus is to pray in love. The chief motive and the chief object of our prayers is love.” “Jesus urged us to pray that God’s kingdom power would prevail in every situation. The kingdom of God is indicated by Christ’s ruling presence, That’s what we pray for *in Jesus’ name*.”

Karl Barth said that God cleanses our prayers, using his wisdom in the answer we receive. Archbishop Richard Trench said, “We must not conceive prayer as an overcoming of God’s reluctance, but a laying hold of his highest willingness.” So, if Jesus has told us to pray in his name, how can we doubt that he will hear us and answer us? Let us live our lives in Jesus’ name, so that we may be ready when the answer to our prayer comes.

The Building committee wishes to express appreciation to everyone who participated in the Congregational Building Meeting. Follow up comments have been positive.

Patrick Perez is completing the construction drawings that will accompany the application for permits to complete the site work associated with tiling our ditch and completing a building pad. The application and drawings will be submitted to the Town of Garner, North Carolina Department of Transportation, and to Wake County.

An auction is scheduled for September 29, 2012, to benefit the Building Fund. Randy Creech is conducting the auction and will be contacting members about serving on various committees. This is expected to be a major fund raising event. Please think of items you or someone you know can donate, plan to attend and invite others to attend. Randy will make this a very enjoyable event.

Periodic Building Committee updates will be made during the worship services when significant events occur, or are planned. As of April 8, 2012, we had received \$447,464 or 43.65% of the \$1,023,310 pledged in May, 2010 for the new building. We have also received \$36,658 in memorials and other non-pledged gifts. The total Building Fund Account is currently at \$754,540. Members are asked to consider making a contribution to The Building Fund as a means of recognizing a gift giving occasion such as a birthday, anniversary, promotion, etc. If you are willing to make an in-kind contribution when construction begins, such as landscaping, (think Sweat equity) please make this offer known to any member of the Building Committee.

The next meeting of the Building Committee is scheduled for Sunday, April 29 at 5:30 p.m. in the Bible classroom and is open to all members of the congregation. Minutes of the of the Building Committee meetings are on file in the office of Kim Tingler and are available for review by Saint Andrews members. Thank you for your support, patience, understanding and encouragement in working through the Building Plan Process. Please share your thoughts and concerns about the work of the Building Committee with Vince Revels, Chair of the Building Committee.

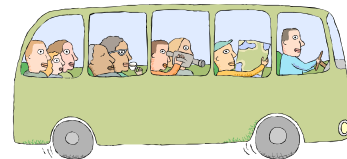


### MINISTRY FAIR
