TEACHERS CORNER-By Paul Sims

Someone recently asked, "Why would God allow an evil person to take the lives of twenty innocent children?" This is one of a class of questions that include things like, "Why does God permit wars?" and "Why does God let tornados kill people?" All these questions boil down to one, really: "Why does God let things happen that we don't think are right?" I have avoided using this column to express my opinion, but there's really no way for me to deal with this question other than to offer it.

Let's start with the last half of the question first – the 'we don't think are right' part. We could take a lesson from Job 38:1-42:6. Go ahead and read it, I'll wait 'til you're done.

While we may feel outrage, or pain, or anger, or whatever, we must always be in the proper position. That position is that God is God and we are not. That doesn't mean we have to be happy with what God does or does not do, but it does mean that God doesn't fit in any box we have. To try to put God in a box is to elevate ourselves above God, to make of ourselves idols, arbiters, judges over the things that truly only God may judge. We can question God's motives and actions all we want, so long as we let God be God. Ask your questions, but do it worshipfully, seeking wisdom and comfort. God will not fail to grant these things to those who seek them. James 4:2b-3a says, 'You do not have, because you do not ask. You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly'. Let us question the Lord reverently.

Now to the first part of the question: "Why does God allow...?" For me, the short answer to this is that God doesn't allow – *we do*. (Matthew 7:11 – 'If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good things to those who ask him! It is God's pleasure and will that we have good things; Jesus has said so!) God did not create evil. Evil came – and still comes – through the disobedience of humankind to the will of God. Before the Fall of Man, the world was a place where God walked with and talked directly to his Creation. In our fallen state, we lost the ability to enter into intimate relation to God. That's why Jesus came – to restore us to intimate relation, to reconcile us to himself. There is no evil with God. Separation from God is the source of evil.

How many times did a priest or a Levite pass by the shooter of those children? Was there no Good Samaritan to lead him away from the path that turned him into a mass murderer? God didn't allow this to happen. *We did!* Let us pray that the next person who may plot evil is instead ministered to, so that they may do good instead.

The Shepherding Ministry

April 2013 Building Committee Update

Implementation of our site improvement plan is progressing well. All the clearing and grubbing is completed, the logs have been carried to the saw mill, about two-thirds of the tile has been placed in the ditch and the undercutting to remove the undesirable soil has begun. When the ditch is completely tiled and the undercutting is finished, fill dirt will be hauled in and compacted. Three sub-committees were appointed at the last Building Committee Meeting: A committee to organize fund raising activities, a committee to determine the best way to continue the Capital Campaign beyond 12-31-13 and a committee to recommend a Design/Builder or Architect and Builder for the new building. The next fund raising activity will be a huge church-wide yard on June 1. The committee agreed to move forward in the development of plans for the building and obtain the necessary approvals so that construction can begin when funds become available. The Builder/Designer sub-committee met and developed a plan for screening and recommending a designer and builder. Invitations were mailed on March 18 to five Design/Builders and five Architects giving each of them the opportunity to interview with this sub-committee. The interviews are scheduled to begin after Easter. As of March 10 we have received \$579,769.75 or 56.6% of the \$1,025,310 pledged in May 2010 for the new building. We have also received \$79,194.92 in non pledged gifts. Minutes of the Building Committee are on file in the church office and are available for review by Saint Andrews members. Thank you for your support, patience, understanding and encouragement in working through the Building Plan Process. Please share your thoughts and concerns about the work of the building committee with Vince Revels, Chair of the Building Committee.
